Course Description

Economics is the social science that studies the effort to satisfy seemingly unlimited wants with scarce resources. This course is a comprehensive study of the choices and decisions people make about how to use the world's resources. Students will study the basics of economics such as economic systems, supply and demand, market structures, money and banking, financial markets, business cycles and economic indicators. Students will also study the government's role in the economy and the global economy. Economic analysis is applied throughout society, in business, finance, and government, but also in crime, education, the family, health, law, politics, religion, social institutions, war, and science. Because this discipline is so pervasive in our world students will learn about economic concepts not only through traditional methods but also through current events discussion and analysis.
